- Assist with laundry services, including washing, drying, and folding linens and towels.

- Ensure all cleaning equipment and supplies are used safely and stored properly.
- Follow health and safety regulations, including the proper handling of cleaning chemicals.
- Assist with seasonal deep cleaning and special cleaning projects as directed.
- Provide friendly and helpful service when interacting with guests on the property.
- Collaborate with the guest services and maintenance teams to ensure seamless operations.
